THE following Address having been transmitted to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has by him been presented to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Governour and Company of the English Colony of Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations in New-England in America.

May it please your Majesty,

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, do most humbly beg Leave to approach your sacred Person with this our humble Address, to condole with your Majesty for the inexpressible Loss we have sustained by the Death of our late Sovereign, of blessed Memory, your dear Father and Royal Predecessor: Which Loss could no otherwise have been repaired to us, than by the Succession of a Prince of your Majesty's Virtues and Experience, under whose Influence and Protection we may have all possible Assurances of enjoying all our Franchises and Liberties, as they have been most graciously conferred upon us, and transmitted down from Time to Time by your Royal Ancestors.

The Experience and Knowledge your Majesty has had in the Affairs of the British Nation, as well as your great Wisdom, Justice, and Clemency, is no small Enlargement of our Zeal and Affection for your Majesty's Royal Person, and undoubted Right to the Crowns of Great Britain.

May the God of Heaven, by whom Kings reign, ever preserve and bless your Majesty's Royal Person and Government, may He grant your Majesty's Reign to be peaceable, long and prosperous over us; and that when it pleaseth Him to call you from this earthly Crown to a Heavenly one, we may have an uninterrupted Succession of your Royal Heirs to reign over us, and sway the Scepter of the
