THE following Address having been transmitted to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has by him been presented to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address, of the Governour, Council and General Assembly of the Province of New Jersey in America.

May it please your Majesty,

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Governour, Council and Assembly of your Province of New Jersey, humbly beg Leave to joyn in expressing the universal Joy which has spread itself over all the British Dominions, upon your Majesty's happy Accession to the Crown.

We might have sunk under the Weight of so great a Loss as that of our late good and gracious King, had not Providence raised up your Majesty to fill the Throne with Virtues and Accomplishments which give us the highest Expectations, and assure us that the great and wise Designs begun in his Reign will now be carried on to their utmost Perfection. The Protection of Mankind in their civil Rights and Liberties, and in the free Exercise of Religion, against Ambition and Persecution, is what we rejoyce to see transmitted from Father to Son, as the peculiar Care of the most illustrious House of Hanover.

Your Majesty's early Zeal and undaunted Valour in Defence of so glorious a Cause; your Royal Comfort's distinguished Piety, that could not be shaken by the dazzling Offer of a Crown; and so numerous and hopeful a Royal Issue, brought up under such an Influence and such Examples, give us sure Prefages, that the Blessings which we now enjoy under your Majesty will descend without Interruption to our latest Posterity.

His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Duty arising from Wine Licences give Notice, That constant Attendance is given at their Office in Surrey-Street in the Strand, for the Dispatch of the Business thereof, on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, in the Forenoon, Holidays excepted. And whereas His Majesty's said Commissioners for managing the said Revenue have received certain Information of divers Persons presuming to retail Wine without Licence, and to whom Letters have been sent advertizing them of the Penalties incurred thereby, These are also to give Notice, that unless such Persons do speedily apply themselves to the said Commissioners, the Laws in such Cases made and provided will be forthwith put in Execution.
