'To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Governour, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly in the Province of Maryland.

Mon Gracious Sovereign, W E your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Governour, and the Upper and Lower Houles of Affembly in Mary-land, now convened, beg Leave to express the deep Senfe we have of our great Lois by the Death of your Royal Father King George the First, of bleffed Memory; a Prince of most heroick and ineftimable Virtues, under whole Administration our pure and holy Religion was supported and piousity propagated, our Laws, Liberties and Properties maintain'd and ftrenuoufly defended, and all other Bleffings that a free People could expect from the best of Kings, dispensed among us; the Reflexion of his Death makes us justily lament our mighty Lofs, and humbly beg Leave to approach your Majefty with the Tribute of our Tears due to our late most gracious Sovereign; and after having paid this Duty to his glorious Memory, joyfully to offer our moft fincere Congratulations for your Majefty's Accellion to the Throne of your Royal Ancestors, and to affure your Majesty, that we have not the leaft Realon to doubt our being equally happy under your Majefty's Government, the Vir-tues of your great and Royal Father being in-herent in your Majefty. And we most earneftly befeech your Majefty to believe, altho' at this Diffance from your Royal Prefence, none of your Majefty's Subjects can have a more awful and juft Regard for your Majefty, than the People of this Province. And we double new that the Creat and Divise devoitly pray, that the Great and Divine Being will shower down Blessings on your

fort, and your Royal Progény, to be a Blefling to your Kingdoms till Time shall be no more
