THIS Day his Excellency the Lord-Lieutenant went to the House of Peers, with the usual Solemnity, and gave the Royal Assent to the two following Bills, viz.

An Act for granting to His Majesty an additional Duty on Beer, Ale, Strong-Waters, Wine, Tobacco, and other Goods: and Merchandizes therein mentioned, and also a Tax on Salaries, Profits of Employments, Fees and Pensions, and for securing the Repayment of Fifty Thousand Pound Sterling formerly advanced to His late Majesty for the use of the Publick, together with the Interest thereof. And,
An Act for accepting the solemn Affirmation or Declaration of the People called Quakers, instead of an Oath in the usual Form.

After which, the Two Houses adjourn'd themselves to Tuesday the 2d Day of April next.

Letters from Paris dated the 27th Instant N. S. bring Advice, that the Orders to be sent respectively to Admiral Hopson and the Spanish Governours in the West-Indies have been finally settled and adjusted, and that the 20th of May next, N. S. is fixed for the opening of the Congress at Soissons.
