The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Earl of Lincoln to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Cambridge, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

Strasbourg, April 14, N. S. The Right Honourable the Lord Waldegrave arrived here the 12th Instant from Paris. His Lordship proposes to set out to Morrow Morning early for Ulm, thence to proceed down the Danube to Vienna. The Marshal du Bourg, Commander in Chief of the French Forces in Alsace, and M. de Harlay Intendant of the Province, have shewn his Lordship all possible Honours since his Arrival here.

Whitehall, April 12.

Sir Charles Wager, with Part of the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, arrived the 9th Instant at Spithead from the Coast of Spain; having left the rest of the Squadron at Gibraltar, under the Command of Captain Stewart, to bring away such Part of the Garrison as is to come home. The Right Honourable the Earl of Portmore, Governour of Gibraltar, is returned with Sir Charles Wager; the Siege of that Place having been entirely raised before his Departure.

This Day one of His Majesty's Messengers arrived from Madrid, with Letters of the 10th Instant, N. S. giving an Account, that the Court of Spain had agreed, to what had lately been settled at Paris, concerning the reciprocal Orders to be sent to the several Admirals and Governours in the West-Indies for executing the Preliminaries; and that Mr. Keene, His Majesty's Minister,

had forwarded to Gibraltar his Majesty's Orders for the Troops that were intended to be sent home, to come away with the Men of War that were left behind: So that we may soon expect to hear of their Arrival.

Whitehall, April 13.

His Majesty has been pleased to order Letters Patents to pass the Great Seal, for granting the Dignity of a Baronet of the Kingdom of Great Britain, unto Henry Gough of Edgbarton, in the County of Warwick, Esq;

His Majesty has been pleased to nominate and appoint Mr. David Gregory, to continue Professor of Modern History in the University of Oxford.

Navy Office, April 3, 1728,

Whereas several Seamen lately belonging to His Majesty's Ship the *Ludlow Castle*, laid up and paid off at Woolwich, did, during the said Ship's Continuance at Boston in New England, absent themselves from her, for which absent Time or Times they have been chequed out of Wages and Victuals: These are to give Notice, that if any of the said Seamen will attend the Navy Board, they shall be heard as, to the Reasons they may have to give for absenting themselves from their Duty, and what else they can offer in their Justification.

Wine Licence Office, April 2, 1728.

All Persons owing or engaged for Arrears of Rent for Wine Licences, or whose Licences are expired, are hereby required to take Notice, that if they do not pay their said Arrears, and renew their said Licences with all Speed, they will be forthwith prosecuted for the same. And whereas His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the said Revenue have receiv'd certain Information of divers Persons presuming to retail Wine without Licence, and to whom Letters have been sent advertising them of the Penalties incur'd thereby, these are also to give Notice, that unless such Persons do speedily apply themselves to the said Commissioners, the Laws in such Cases made and provided will be forthwith put in Execution.
