Vienna, May 19, N. S.

COUNT Philip Kinsky arrived here the 17th Instant, and is preparing to set out for the Court of Great Britain.

Stockholm, May 8. Instructions are drawing up for the Swedish Plenipotentiaries appointed to go to the Congress at Soissons, and will be ready in a few Days to be laid before the King and Senate for their Approbation: The Secretary of the Embassy, who is to carry them, proposes to set out for Soissons about the End of next Week.

Hague, June 8. The States General have informed the Spanish Secretary here of their sending a Squadron of Eight Men of War to the Streights, to the End his Court might be acquainted with it, for preventing any Jealousies. Their High Mightinesses having ordered M. Goslinga, one of the Ministers of this State appointed to go to the Congress at Soissons, to hasten thither, he set out the 2d Instant to go Post to that Place. M. Hop, another of those Ministers, being now pretty well recovered of an Ague, will be going thither the End of this Week. M. Hurgrogne, the third of those Ministers, continues yet in Zealand, without any Day fixed for his Departure.

Whitehall, June 3.

On Wednesday last their Majesties, with his Royal Highness the Duke, the Princess Royal, their Royal Highnesses the Princesses Caroline, Mary, and Louisa, went from

St. James's to reside for some Time at Richmond.

On Saturday their Majesties went to Datchet Common, where the Regiment of Dragoons commanded by the Right Honourable the Earl of Stair passed in Review before His Majesty and made a very fine Appearance.

The King has appointed Saturday the 22d Instant to review the Regiments of Foot commanded by Brigadier Kirk and Colonel Harrison, upon Black-Heath.

Whitehall, June 4.

Letters from Compiègne of the 10th Instant N. S. give an Account; That the Cardinal de Fleury designed to set out from thence for Soissons the 13th in the Morning, to receive and return the Visits of Compliment that Day; and that the Congress was to be opened the next; when all the Ministers were invited to dine with his Eminency. His Excellency Mr. Walpole was to go from Compiègne to Soissons the 12th.
