N the 19th Instant the Lord Glenorchy, His Britannick Majesty's Minister to the Court of Denmark, arrived here from England, in his Way to Copenhagen. The Earl of Chester-field and his Lordship have since been in Conference with the Pensionary and the Greffier of the States General. The Lord Glenorchy intends to proceed for Denmark in Two or Three Days. Lieutenant General Grovenfleyn, who is lately come from his Government of Bergen-op-Zoom, has taken the Oaths to the States General for the Employment of Quarter Master General. Some of the Domesticks and Baggage of Don Louisd'Acur-ha, who is appointed Ambasladour from the King of Portugal to this Republick, are arrived here, and he is daily expected himself: After his Arrival M. Mendoza the Portuguese Minister here, will forthwith return to Lisbon. M. Hop, Envoy of this Republick to the King of Great Britain, is preparing to return to England in a few Days. M. Hurgrogne is expected this Week from Zealand, and will speedily follow the other two Ambassadours of this State, who are gone to the Congress at Soissons. To-morrow the States of Holland and West-Friesland will begin to meet here.
