Soissons, June 19, N. S.

N the 12th Infant in the Evening their Excellencies Mr. Stanhope and Mr. Poyntz arrived here from Paris, as did his Excellency Mr. Walpole from Compiegne. They found here Baron Penterriedter, with the three Spanish Plenipotentiaries, the Marquelles de Fenelon and Brancas, and M. Gollinga. A few Hours af-ter the Arrival of the faid British Ambassadours, came Count Sinzendorf. On the 13th in the Morning arrived the Cardinal de Fleury; as did M. Hop on the 16th. All these Ministers were each and feverally received in the fame Manner, viz. without any other Ceremony but that of the Difcharge of 12 Pieces of Cannon at their entring the Town: On their Arrival they were welcomed by the Intendant, the Bishop and Chapter, and the feveral Bodies of the Magistracy in their Formalities.

In the Visits and Interviews the Plenipotentiaries had together on the 13th, it was agreed that the Congress should be opened the next Day.

On Monday the 14th, at Eleven in the Morning, they all allembled at the Caffle, with the Train and Equipage limited by the Itegulation at Cambray. The French Plenipotentiaries received the reft at the Door of the Hall; and being all feated at a round Table without Ceremony, (conformably to what was practiced at Cambray,) Count Sinzendorf opened the Conference by a fhort Then the Cardinal de Fleury made Speech. a Speech. Which done, the Ministers produced their full Powers, and it was agreed that those with the Character of Ambailador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary fhould be made use of, as being properest to be inserted in the Instrument of the Treaty when they fhould come to fign.
