N the 22d Instant, being the Anniverlary of His Britannick Majefty's Succession to the Crown, the Earl of Chefterfield gave a splendid Entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers, and the chief Perfons here. On the 24th arrived from Brullels Don Louis d'Acunha, to refide here as Minister of the King of Portugal, in the Room of M. Mendoza, who will foon fet out for Lisbon. On the 25th the Lord Glenorchy proceeded from hence for Copen-hagen. M. Hurgrogne, one of the Plenipotentiaries of this Republick for the Congress at Soillons, is arrived from Zealand, and will forthwith proceed to Soiflons. On the 25th Inflant the Baron de Hompesch, Nephew of General Hompesch, was introduced by M. de Boetselaar (who is Father in Law of the faid Baron) into the College of Nobility of Holland and West-Friseland, was entred in their Register, and received by them as one of the Nobles; and accordingly took his Place among the States of the faid Province, who are now affembled here.

Whereas by the Att of Parliament of the 3th of Queen Anne, for establishing a General Post Office, it is amongs other things enatted, That no Person or Persons whatsoever shall have the carrying and delivering of any Letters whatloever, un-lefs fuch Perfons only as shall be authorized thereunto by the Postmasser General, under the Penalty of Five Pounds for every feveral Offence against the Tenor of the faid A&, one Moiety thereof to the King, and the other Moiety to the Person who shall fue for the same, with full Costs of Suit; Tet notwithstanding, it is found that Letters are frequently carried and delivered by Perfons who are not authorized thereunto, but by fome illegal Means possibles themselves of Letters which should have passed through the General Poss Office, and in particular Ship Letters, and to make an Advantage to themsfelves, demand Money for the Post of Juch Letters, and fometimes by counterfeiting the Marks of the Office exact more than the legal Post would come to had they been regu-larly taxed in the Office. To prevent therefore as much as pollible this clandeftine manner of carrying and deli-woring of Letters, which is very prejudicial to the Subject in many Respects, and also a Loss to His Ma-

jeft is Revenue, • It is ordered by the Postmaster General, That every Westmin-Letter Carrier whofe Walk is within London, Westminster, or Southwark, Shall, as a Badge of his Employ-

ment, wear a Brass Ticket upon some (the prost visible) Part of his Gloathing, with the King's Arms upon it, which Ticket he is always to wcar whilf he is upon Duty.

And all Perfons who shall discover any Letter Carrier, Porter, or other Perfon or Perfons what fuever, delivering Letters which should have passed through the General Post Office without Juch Badge or Ticket upon the most wilible Part of their Cloathing, are defired to give Information thereof to the Postmaster General, that the Offenders may be profecuted according to Law; and for fuch Information they shall meet with all fitting En-couragement.
