HE Prince Regent of Naflau Siegen, has taken the Oath in the Council of State of this Republick as Colonel of a Regiment of Foot, in which he has alfo a Company. On the 21ft Inftant, Brigadier Sutton his Britannick Majefty's Envoy to Caflel, and Sir Robert Sutton, with the Counters of Sunderland (his Lady) and her Sifter, went to Amfterdam; from whence the first is to proceed to Cassel, and the others to Aix la Chapelle and to Spaa, to make use of those Waters.
