Most Gracious Sovereign, W E your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects the Council and Assembly of your Majefty's Island of Jamaica, beg Leave to take this first Opportunity of condoling your Majeffy upon the Death of your late Royal Father; at the fame Time that we pub-lift this our Concern for fo great a Lofs, we cannot but acknowledge the Bleffing of God in fupplying it by the Eftablishment of your Majesty, whose Accession to the Throne we heartily congratulate.

The many early Inftances of your Maje-fty's Goodnels must give your Subjects the greatest Alfurances of Happinels; And what Quiet, what Content, must they enjoy who are more immediately in your Presence, when we, whom Fortune has removed by a very diffant Situation, are so sensible of the happy Influences of your Government?

Among the many Marks of your Majefty's Royal Favour, we must particularly diftin-guith that of your Majesty's Appointment of Major General Hunter to be our Governour, the good Effects of whole Administration we

already in Part feel, and from whom we conceive the greatest Hopes of being once more a flourishing People.

Such Goodnels in your Majefty, and time-ly Care of your remoteft Subjects, must naturally draw from us the fincereft Returns of Gratitude, and infpire us with the trueft Sen-timents of Duty and Loyalty, which we shall upon all Occasions with Chearfulnels express.

Hague. July 27. On the 23d Instant, the States of Holland and Weft Freifland adjourned till the 11th of next Month, af-ter having disposed of the vacant Employ-ments in their Gift. On the 25th Instant, in the Morning, the States received an Express from the Helder, with the News of the Arrival of Ten Ships from the Eaft Indies, Six of which belong to the Chamber of Amfterdam, and the other Four to Zealand; Six more are expected. Yefterday Count Naffau arrived here from England. Don Louis d'Acunha has had feveral Conferences with the Deputies of the States, about the Differences be-tween the Crown of Portugal and this Republick touching Commerce in Africa; which are in a fair Way to be accommodated.
