ETTERS from Gratz of the 21st Instant give an Account, that the Lord Waldegrave, His Britannick Majesty's Ambassadour, who set out from hence the 9th Instant, arrived at Gratz the next Day. The States of Stiria have made his Imperial Majesty a Free Gift of 30008 German Florins: They exculed themselves for not giving 60000, as had been done in the Time of his Father the Emperour Leopold, on Account of the great Expences they have lately been at for repairing the Ways to Gratz. The Emperour made a Promotion of 20 Chamberlains and nine Privy-Councellours (all of them, except two or three, Men of Quality of the Province of Stiria) on the Day he received Homage from the States, which was on the 6th Inflant. On the 14th Inflant Sig. Bragadities of Normal Amba Colours and the States of the 14th Inflant Sig. ni, the Venetian Ambassadour, made his publick Entry into Gratz: His Excelency was met at a Convent a little different from the Town by 50 Coaches, with fire Horses each belonging to the Great Of fix Horses each, belonging to the Great Officers of the Court, and the Lords of his Imperial Majesty's Bed-Chamber; and was conducted through the principal Streets. He had fix Pages and leveral Officers on Horseback, with 12 Footmen and a Swiss who preceded in rich Liveries. Four of his own Coaches, drawn by six Horses each, closed the March. He had his publick Audience of the Emperour on the 15th, to which he was introduced by the Grand Marshal Count Coloredo. The Marquels Rialp is the only Minister who is named to attend his Imperial Majesty in his Progress from Gratz to Trieste, which is now fixed to the 16th of next Month; and 'tis reckoned his Imperial Majesty will return to Gratz by the 26th of September.
