Florence, September 10, N. S.

ON the 4th Instant two Proclamations by the Great Duke were published, one restoring the Commerce betwixt this and the Ecclesiastical State, all Suspicions of Danger of Infection from the Fair of Sinigaglia being quite vanished. The other was, to promise Impunity and a Reward of 300 Crowns to any Person, who within a Fortnight should discover any of the Malefactors that disturb the publick Quiet, by robbing in the very Streets of this Town in the Night-time; yet some Disorders of this Nature have been committed since. The same Day arrived here two Couriers, one from Turin with the News of the Death of the Queen of Sardinia; another from Munich, with that of the Birth of a Prince of Bavaria. That Night there were fine Illuminations in those Parts of the Town, where are Churches of the Augustin Fryars, to celebrate the Discovery of the Body of St. Augustin in a Vault of St. Peter's Church at Pavia, which happened to be found there in the Year 1695, but it has ever since been much disputed among Antiquaries whether it be his Body: At last the Pope has judged it to be the true Body of that Saint, and has ordered a Festival to be celebrated by all the Augustins upon that Account. On the 6th at Night the Great Duke went to the Opera; and the Day following being a great Festival at Prato, a Town in this Neighbourhood, the Princess Violante went thither accompanied by several Ladies. The Envoy of France, and the Resident of England, have each had their Audiences this Week of the Princess Violante, to congratulate her Highness upon the Birth of the young Prince of Bavaria.

Fontainebleau, Sept. 24, N. S. On the 22d Instant the King returned hither from Versailles between Seven and Eight a-Clock in the Evening. It is uncertain whether the Queen will come to this Place, which is intirely left to the Opinion of the Physicians. In case her Majesty shall not be able to make the Journey, it is said that the King will go twice or thrice again to Versailles. The King has given to M. d'Heraville the Command of the Regiment of Foot of Burgundy, vacant by the Death of the Marquês de Feuquiers. The States of Britany are to meet the 1st of next Month.
