Fontainebleau, October 1, N. S.

THE Queen is expected at Paris the 4th Instant, to perform her Devotions at Notre Dame and at the Church of St. Genevieve, and on the 9th her Majesty will come to Fontainebleau: Upon which Day the foreign Ambassadors are to compliment their most Christian Majesties on Occasion of the Queen of Sardinia's Death. The Ceremonial prescribes, that they should appear in long Cloaks and Weepers. The Count de Feuquieres, Captain of a Man of War, and formerly Governour of Martinico, is made Grand Croix of the Order of St. Louis, with a Pension of 6000 Livres per Annum. A Pension is likewise given to the Son of the late Marquis de Feuquieres, of 1500 Livres per Annum. The Dutches of Bourbon is here with her Mother-in-Law, and the Duke is expected in a few Days from Chantilly. Letters from Madrid of the 20th of last Month, say it was advised from Cadiz, that four Men of War and a small Frigate, having six Months Provisions on Board, were ready to set Sail from that Port. That the Duke of Ripperda, who lately made his Escape from the Castle of Segovia; passed through Miranda del Duero, on the Frontiers of Portugal, the 8th of September, in order (as is supposed) to go to Oporto. And that on the 20th in the Evening the Dutches his Lady was seized at Madrid in her own House; and put under a Guard of 14 Soldiers by his Catholick Majesty's Order, for having assisted the Duke with Means to make his Escape.
