N the 5th Inftant his most Christian Majefty was drelled for the first Time, and all the Court admitted to fee him at Dinner; and Yesterday the Queen, accompanied by all the Court, went to the Parish Church to hear Te Deum sung upon the Occasion of the King's entire Re-covery. The Archbishop of Vienne officia-ted, and the King's Chapel Musick perform-ed the Service. This Day his Excellency Mr. Walpole goes from hence, to celebrate the King his Master's Birth-Day, at Paris, on the roth Inftant.

Hague, Nov. 12. On the 8th Inftant an Express came in from Ofnabrug, with an Account of the Elector of Cologne's being chosen on the 4th Bishop and Prince of that Country. The States of Holland and Weft-Friefland are to meet again on the 17th In-ftant. On the 10th Inftant N.S. being the Anniverlary of His Britannick Majefty's Birth-Day, the Earl of Chefterfield His Majefty's Ambafladour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, entertained at Dinner the foreign Ministers and the Perfons of Diffinc-tion of this Republick, at Three very large Tables, placed in a great Room, which his Excellency had built for that Purpole; and Yesterday his Excellency gave a magnificent Ball and Supper to about 400 Persons: At the fame Time two Fountains of Wine, adorned with Illuminations, were running for the Populace; and the Mufick was playing till Three a-Clock this Morning.

St. James's, November 2. This Morning the King and Queen, with His Royal Highnels the Duke, and their

Royal Highnesses the Princesses, went to Hide Park ; where the King's own Regiment of Dragoons, commanded by the Right Honourable the Lord Carpenter Lieutenant-General, paffed in Review before His Ma-jefty, and made a very fine Appearance.
