**O**N Saturday the 19th Instant, in the Evening, the King of Sweden returned to the Palace here from a Progress he had made in the Country. His Majesty made some Stay at Nykoping, in Expectation of being joyned there by his Brother Prince George: But an Account coming in the mean Time of the terrible Calamity that has lately befallen Copenhagen, two Thirds of which City are said to be burnt down, it was therefore judged, that as the Prince was at the Danish Court when the Fire happened, he could not in so great a Confusion get an Opportunity to take his Leave of their Danish Majesties so soon as he otherwise designed; wherefore the King resolved to wait no longer for him. There is now Advice, that the Prince having passed the Sound this Day Sennight, is upon the Road hither. The Queen of Sweden had last Week a Fever that confined her some Days to her Bed: But her Majesty is now so well recovered, that she has appeared in Publick ever since the King came back. Last Sunday this Court laid aside Mourning for the late Duke of York; and to Day they go into Mourning for the late Queen of Sardinia: On Monday last all the Senatours met in Council, the King being present.

*Copenhagen, Nov. 9, N. S.* M. de Pudetwitz, Minister from the King of Prussia, arrived here on Thursday last, and Yesterday had his first private Audience of the King and Queen of Denmark. Since the dreadful Fire, by which so great a Part of this City was consumed, one Battallion of the Foot Guards is gone to Quarter in Kiope; a small Town about five German Miles from hence;

and a Battallion of the Grenadier Guards is marched to Roschiold. A Battallion of the Regiment of Zeeland is divided in different Places in the Country; and a Part of the Horse Guards lies between Fredericksberg and this Town. The rest of the Garrison is lodged in the Houses that remain.

*Hague, Nov. 19, N. S.* M. de Slingeland, Son of the Great Pensionary, was this Day declared Receiver-General of the Province of Holland without any Opposition, in the Room of M. Hogerheyde deceased. The States of the said Province have at the same Time disposed of all other Civil and Military Vacancies upon their Repartition. The Regiment commanded by the late Brigadier Soutelande is given to M. Kretschmar a Captain of the Guards.
