The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas it hath been reprefented to His Majesty at this Board, that the frequent and long publick Mournings have occafioned a great Decay of Trade, and that great Num-bers of His Majefty's Subjects, employed in the Silk Manufacture, are reduced to the utmost Extremities on Account thereof : His Majesty was this Day pleased to take into His Royal Confideration the Hardships and Difcouragements that Io many of His trading Subjects labour under, in Refpect of the long Continuance, both of publick and pri-vate Mournings; and His Majefty being defirous, as far as in Him lies, to apply a proper Remedy thereto, and out of a tender Concern for the Good and Welfare of His People, to give all due Encouragement to the Trade and Manufactures of this King-dom; is gracioufly pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, hereby to declare, That for the future, upon any Publick or Court Mourning, His Majefty will not re-quire or expect, that any Perfors whatfoever fhould put their Coaches, Chairs, or any of their Servants into Mourning ; and that the Time for the Continuance of all fuch Publick or Court Mourning, be no more than, one half of the Time, that has been usual and customary on those Occasions.

By a Letter from Captain Warren Commander of His Majesty's Ship the Solebay, da-ted at South-Carolina, Oct. r, we have the following Account, That pursuant to Com-modore St. Loe's Orders he failed the 10th of June from Port-Royal, and the 3d of July anchored at La Vera Cruz : From thence he fent the King of Spain's Orders to his Viceroy at Mexico, the Receipt of which that Viceroy owned by the Return of the Poft, affuring Captain Warrên, that he had given Directions to the proper Officers to ule all possible Diligence and Dispatch in the Restitution of the South-Sea Company's Ships and Effects which had been feized in the Port of La Vera Cruz : Agreeably to which, the 20th of July the Prince Frederick and two of the Company's Snows were put into the Polletion of their Agents there; the 12th of August the Supercargoes were defired to begin to receive the Cargo of the Prince Fre-derick ; and on the 13th Captain Warren 25th of December next,

A'T the Court at St. James's the 14th Day failed from thence, leaving a Spanish Rear-of November, 1728. Admiral and tour Sail of Fifty Gunn'd Ships in the Port, which were arrived there from Cadiz.
