Vienna, November 6.

A Deputation arrived here from the Dyet at Presbourg to congratulate the Emperour on his Name-Day, which was the 4th Instant: The same was observed with great Magnificence at Court; their Imperial Majesties dined in publick, heard a Concert of Musick, and afterwards were with the two eldest Arch-dutchesses at an Opera, which lasted from Four till Nine a-Clock at Night.

Hague, Nov. 23, N. S. By a Ship arrived from the East-Indies, the only one that remained to come this Year, we have an Account, that three of our East-India Ships, bound, two of them for Batavia, and the other for Ceylon, were lost at the Cape of Good Hope in a Storm, no more than 30 Persons being saved out of all their Crews. The States of Holland continue their Assembly, and the Great Pensionary being pretty well recovered of an Indisposition, is expected to assist at it To-morrow. Baron Keppel is on his Return hither from Berlin. The Count de Tefsin, (who was formerly Envoy from Sweden to the Emperour) is arrived here with his Lady from Stockholm; they intend to set out in a few Days for Paris, to make some Stay there.

Paris, Nov. 24, N. S. On Sunday the 14th Instant the King assisted between Five and Six a-Clock in the Evening at Te Deum sung in his Chapel at Fontainebleau; after which his Majesty went to the Duke of Orleans's Apartment, to see a Firework played

upon a large Reservoir of Water near that Part of the Castle; and for several Days past great Rejoycings have been made here, at Paris, upon the happy Occasion of his Majesty's entire Recovery. On the 15th their Excellencies Mr. Stanhope and Mr. Walpole arrived here from Fontainebleau; and the Garde des Sceaux came hither the 16th. On the 19th their most Christian Majesties went to Petitbourg, and arrived the next Day at Versailles. The same Day Cardinal de Fleury dined in this City, and went the next Night to Issy; a little Town about a League distant from hence. The Marchioness de Bethune, Sister to the late Queen of Poland, is dead here at the Age of 93 Years. The Duke de la Tremouille, who returned ill from Fontainebleau, and was reported to have the Small-Pox, is perfectly recovered. The Bishop of Ulez died the 18th Instant, in the 93d Year of his Age, and was buried the 20th in the Church of St. Gervais. The Princess Dowager of Conti returned last Week from the Sea Coast, where she had been bathed for the Bite of a Dog.
