THE 4th Instant being the Feast of St. Carlos Borromeo, whose Name one of the Infantes of Spain bears, the same was celebrated at Court with the usual Ceremonies; and Count Koenigslegg gave a magnificent Entertainment to the foreign Ministers and several Persons of Distinction, it being likewise the Festival of his Imperial Majesty's Name-Day. The Duke of Bourbonville, first Plenipotentiary of Spain at the Congress of Soissons, arrived here the 5th Instant, and was immediately admitted to an Audience of their Catholick Majesties. The same Evening two Couriers arrived from France with Letters of the 28th past, giving an Account that his most Christian Majesty was taken ill of the Small Pox the 26th of October.

Hague, Nov. 30. A Minister from the Elector Palatine is arrived here, who is to go immediately over to England, to remain there as Resident in the Room of M. Smidman, who left London last Summer, and is returned home. Count Tesin with his Lady are gone to Brussels, from whence they will proceed to Paris. The States of Holland and West-Friesland continue their Meeting, and have still some vacant Employments to fill up. They write from Zealand, that the States of that Province have given to Lieutenant-General Grovstein the Command of a Regiment of Foot of the late Brigadier Hemert, and the Command of another Regiment of Foot to Brigadier Blanzac.
