Madrid, November 22, N. S.

THE 16th Instant their Catholick Majesties, the Prince of Asturias, and the Infantes, hunted at la Torre del Pardo, about three Leagues from this Place. The 19th there was a very splendid Appearance at Court of foreign Ministers and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment her Catholick Majesty upon St. Elizabeth's Day, whose Name she bears. The King appeared in Publick, and gave Audience to the Marquess d'Arvillar, Ambassadour from his Sardinian Majesty, and to the Marquess de Rangoni, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of Modena. The Duke of Richmond was presented by Mr. Keene to the King, Queen, and the rest of the Royal Family, and was very graciously received by them. The Conde de Soto-Mayor is made a Grandee of Spain; as is likewise the Conde de las Torres, who commanded the Spanish Troops before Gibraltar.

Paris, Dec. 8, N. S. The Bishop of Castres has followed the Example of the Cardinal de Noailles, in publishing a Mandate for the Acceptation of the Bull, &c. The Marble that was taken up from the great Cascade at Marly, has been given to the Curate of St. Sulpice, to adorn the new Church that he is building at Paris: And the Cardinal de Noailles assisted there the last Week, at the Ceremony of laying a Stone of the first Pillar of the West Front. The King goes this Day to Marly, to stay there,

with those of the Court who are named, till the 18th Instant. The Bishop of Grenoble has published a Pastoral Letter, declaring his Approbation not only of the Letter written by the Bishops to the King against the Consultation of the Advocates, but likewise of the Council of Embrun. On the 22d the King hunted two Wolves which had got into the Wood of Bologne. M. de Chaumont Sub-Lieutenant of the Gendarmerie, and Son to M. Bernage Councillor of State, is shortly to be married to Mademoiselle Vaucreffon, Grand-Daughter to M. de la Porte, Cashire to the famous Banker Bernard, a Fortune of 600000 Livres. On the 6th a Service was performed in the Church of Notre Dame for the late Queen of Sardinia: The Bishop of Angiers pronounced a Discourse upon that Occasion.

This Day the Marquess Grimaldi, Envoy Extraordinary from the most Serene Republick of Genoa, at a private Audience, took Leave of His Majesty, and afterwards presented Sig. Gastaldi, to deliver his Credential Letter to His Majesty, as Secretary to reside here from the same most Serene Republick; to which Audiences they were introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

The Marquess Grimaldi was afterwards introduced to take Leave of the Queen, in Her Majesty's Apartment, by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham Her Majesty's
