Etters which came in from Gottenbourg two Days ago, brought Advice of the Arrival there of Mr. Edward Finch, His Britannick Maje-fty's Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Sweden ; and that he propoled to fet out from thence laft Monday, to come hither. Baron Ceder-Creutz late Envoy from this to the Ruffian Court, arrived here on the noth Inftant, and has fince taken Pofleffion of his Poft as Secretary of State. Laft Week the King of Sweden nominated Major-General Baron Bennet to be Governour of the Province of Halland, in the Room of the late Baron Faltzburg; M. Newebaur, former-ly the Swedifh Envoy at Conftantinople, to be Chancellor in Pomerania; and Doctor Tammelin to be Bishop of Abo.

Berlin, Dec. 11, N. S. On the oth Instant in the Afternoon died M. d'Ilgen, Minister of State to his Prussian Majesty, having that Morning been so well as to dispatch a great Deal of Business. On the 9th M. Burk, and Cniphausen, and M. Thulemeyer, Cangieler, and M. d'Ilgen Son of the deceased, went to Potzdam, where the King of Prufia fettled the Administration of his foreign Af-fairs in the following Manner, viz. M. Burk and M. Cniphaufen to be joyntly chief Minifters, and M. Thulemeyer to be their Secretary. M. Cangieler is to act under them, as Secretary in Affairs relating to Germany, and M. d'Ilgen to be first Clerk under him and M. Thulemeyer. A Room is appointed at the Castle where these Persons are to meet twice a Week for the Dilpatch of Bulinefs. The foreign Ministers are to have Audience of the chief Ministers jointly twice a Week. The Margravine Philipe received an Ac-count by Express fome Days ago of the Death of the Abbels of Hertfort, by which that Abbey, worth about 12000 Crowns a Year, falls to her Highnefs, who was Coadjutrix to the late Abbels : It is faid, that as foon as a Chapter can be held, the Princefs Caro-lina, the third Princefs of this Houfe, will be declared Coadjutrix to the Margravine.
