*Stockholm, November 20.*

**L**etters which came in from Gottenbourg two Days ago, brought Advice of the Arrival there of Mr. Edward Finch, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Sweden; and that he proposed to set out from thence last Monday, to come hither. Baron Ceder-Creutz late Envoy from this to the Russian Court, arrived here on the 10th Instant, and has since taken Possession of his Post as Secretary of State. Last Week the King of Sweden nominated Major-General Baron Bennet to be Governour of the Province of Halland, in the Room of the late Baron Falzburg; M. Newebaur, formerly the Swedish Envoy at Constantinople, to be Chancellor in Pomerania; and Doctor Tammelin to be Bishop of Abo.

*Berlin, Dec. 11, N. S.* On the 6th Instant in the Afternoon died M. d'Ilgen, Minister of State to his Prussian Majesty, having that Morning been so well as to dispatch a great Deal of Business. On the 9th M. Burk, and Cniphauen, and M. Thulemeyer, Cangieler, and M. d'Ilgen Son of the deceased, went to Potzdam, where the King of Prussia settled the Administration of his foreign Affairs in the following Manner, viz. M. Burk and M. Cniphauen to be jointly chief Ministers, and M. Thulemeyer to be their Secretary. M. Cangieler is to act under them, as Secretary in Affairs relating to Germany, and M. d'Ilgen to be first Clerk under him and M. Thulemeyer. A Room is appointed at the Castle where these Persons are to meet twice a Week for the Dispatch of Business. The foreign Ministers are to have Audience of the chief Ministers jointly twice a Week. The Margravine Philippe received an Account by Express some Days ago of the Death of the Abbess of Hertfort, by which that Abbey, worth about 12000 Crowns a Year, falls to her Highness, who was Coadjutrix to the late Abbess: It is said, that as soon as a Chapter can be held, the Princess Carolina, the third Princess of this House, will be declared Coadjutrix to the Margravine.
