*Paris, December 29, N. S.*

**O**N the 21<sup>st</sup> the King supped at the Muette, a little Houſe belonging to his Majesty in the Wood of Bologne. On the 20<sup>th</sup> the Dutcheſs Dowager of Orleans retired with the Princeſſes her Daughters to the Convent of Magdelaine de Trenel, to paſs the Holidays, and returned from thence to Day. The Family of Bourbon is gone to paſs the Holidays at Chantilly, and will likewise return from thence to Court this Day. The Marqueſs de Canillac is now thought to be out of Danger. M. Du Puy, Intendant of Canada, arrived here the 20<sup>th</sup> Inſtant: His Office will be executed by the Marqueſs de Beauharnois Governour of that Province, till the Arrival there of a new Intendant. The Dutcheſs de Bouillon is brought to Bed of a Daughter.

*Hague, Dec. 31.* The two Ships which the Dutch Eaſt-India Company have fitted out lately to go directly to Canton in China, have failed from the Texel. This is the firſt Time that that Company have undertaken that Trade directly, which had always been carried on by their Factory at Batavia. The States of Holland and Weſt-Frieſland will meet on the 6<sup>th</sup> of next Month, to conſider on the Propoſal made them for reducing a half per Cent. on the Intereſt of all their Obligations, which is believed will be approved of; and that the Amount of that Reduction, reckoned to be about Se-

ven Millions of Florins per Annum, will be applied to the Expences and Support of the Army. General Keppel, who has been Envoy from this Republick at the Court of Berlin, from whence he deſired to be recalled, arrived here laſt Sunday; he has made the Report of his Tranſactions to the States-General, who have approved of his Services.
