M. Courten, Marshal de Camp, Knight of the Great Cross of St. Lewis, and Colonel of a Swiss Regiment, is dead lately, and succeeded in his Regiment by his Son. The Prince of Montauban, who had bought the Government of Nîmes, enters into the Possession of that Employment by the Death of M. d'Artagnan. The Abbots Serlant and Faily have been sent to the Bastille, for dispersing seditious Papers relating to the Affairs of the Church. It is advised from Madrid, that their Catholick Majesties Journey to the Frontiers of Portugal was fixed for the 7th, and that most of the Foreign Ministers who were to attend the Court set out the 3d and 4th Instant. We have had here for some Days a very hard Frost; and publick Fires are made in most of the principal Streets, for the Sake of the Poor.
