HER most Christian Majesty has been lately blooded by Way of Precaution. The Court goes to Marly the 4th of next Month, when they will leave off the Mourning for the Queen of Sardinia, and resume it a few Days afterwards for the Princess Nathalia, late Sister to the Czar. The King and Queen of Sweden have made her most Christian Majesty a Present of their Pictures. M. Dodart, the King's first Physician, is relapsed, and is dangerously ill. M. Joly de Fleury, Procureur-General, has been indisposed for some Days past. The Abbot de Roye, Grand-Vicar of the Archbishoprick of Rouen, is named Archbishop of Bourges, upon the voluntary Resignation of the Cardinal de Gesvres. The Countess de Tavanne died the 25th Instant. M. de Vilemes has resigned his Regiment of Foot, which the King has given to the Duke de Crussol. The Marquis de Paul, Son to the late Count de la Riviere, succeeds his Father to the Government of St. Brieux.

Hague, Feb. 1, N. S. Yesterday the Earl of Chesterfield, His Britannick Majesty's Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, gave a great Entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers and the English Gentlemen here, on Occasion of the Anniversary of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales's Birth-Day. On the 28th past the Magistrates of Amsterdam met at their Town-House, and settled the Magistracy of their City for this Year. The Court of Justice of Holland have begun the Tryals of the Clerks of the States Secretaries Office, who some time ago were put in Prison, on strong Suspicion of discovering the Secrets of this State, together with some others suspected to be their Accomplices; one of the Clerks has already made an ample Confession: And Sentence will be pronounced upon him one Day this Week. Mr. Titley arrived here three Days ago from England on his Way to Copenhagen, for which Place he intends to set out the 3d Instant. This Evening Mr. Woodward arrived also, on his Way to Dresden.
