ER most Christian Majesty has been lately blooded by Way of Precauti-on. The Court goes to Marly the 4th of next Month, when they will leave off the Mourning for the Queen of Sardinia, and refume it a few Days afterwards for the Princess Nathalia, late Sifter to the Czar. The King and Queen of Sweden have made her most Christian Majesty a Present of their Pictures. M. Dodart, the King's first Physician, is relapfed, and is dangeroufly ill. M. Joly de Fleury, Procureur-General, has been indifpofed for fome Days paft. The Abbot de Roye, Grand-Vicar of the Archbishoprick of Rouen, is named Archbishop of Bourges, upon the voluntary Refignation of the Car-dinal de Gesvres. The Countess de Tavan-nes died the 25th Instant. M. de Vilemes has refigned his Regiment of Foot, which the King has given to the Duke de Crussol. The Marquels de Paul, Son to the late Count de la Riviere, fucceeds his Father to the Government of St. Brieux. Hague, Feb. 7, N. S. Yefterday the Earl of Chefterfield, His Britannick Majefty's

Ambaffadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, gave a great Entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers and the English Gentlemen here, on Occasion of the Anniversary of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales's Birth-Day. On the 28th paft the Magistrates of Amfterdam met at their Town-Houle, and fettled the Magistracy of their City for this Year.
