**Y**ESTERDAY being the Birth-Day of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty which were drawn out upon Oxmantown-Green. And this Day at Noon the Lords Justices met at the Castle, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction upon this Occasion. And at Night there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies.

In order therefore to bring such notorious Offenders to Justice, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs do, in pursuance of the Directions of the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, hereby give Notice, That if any Person or Persons shall discover or apprehend the said Jacob Walter, or Gabriel Jarvis alias Tompkins, or either of them, so as they may be brought to Tryal for return-

ning from Transportation, he or they shall have a Reward of One Hundred Pounds, clear of all Charges, to be paid by the Receiver-General and Cashire of His Majesty's Customs, for each of the aforesaid Persons so apprehended, to be paid on Conviction. The said Jacob Walter is about 50 Years of Age, a tall thin Man, stout and well made, with a longish Face and ruddy Complexion, and formerly wore a light Wig.

Gabriel Jarvis alias Tompkins is something pitted with the Small-Pox, has a very large black Eyebrow, usually wore a light Wig and Fustian Frock, is now supposed to wear his own dark brown Hat, is a tall well made Man, was shot through the Left Arm with a Brace of Bullets.
