THE 23d of last Month, being the Birth-Day of the Great Princess Dowager, who then entered into the 55th Year of her Age, was celebrated at Court with the usual Magnificence; and at Night a new Opera was performed at the chief Theatre. Our Academy of Painters having borrowed of several Gentlemen of this Place a very great Number of fine Pictures, have caused them to be hung up in St. Luke's Chapel, in the Cloyster of the Nunziata; as is their Custom every Fifth Year, for solemnizing with the greater Splendor the Festival of that Saint. All this Week there has been a vast Concourse of all Sorts of People, especially of Gentlemen and Ladies, to view those Pictures. The Princesses have been there; and the Great Duke has sent Orders that they may not be taken away till he has seen them, which he intends to do in a few Days.

Hague, March 4, N. S. The Prince of Nassau-Friseland has been treated frequently since his Arrival here by Persons of Distinction. On the 1st Instant Baron Schwartzembourg, Deputy of the States General from the Province of Friseland, treated his Highness and several Persons of Distinction at Scheveling. This Evening Baron Keppel makes an Entertainment for him at the House in the Wood, where after Supper there is to be a Ball; and Count Welden is to entertain him next Tuesday. The Earl of Chesterfield has ordered Preparations to be made, for celebrating Her Britannick Majesty's Birth-Day with extraordinary Magnificence; at which it is believed his Highness will be present. The Minister of the Elector Palatine is gone from hence for Rotterdam, in order to pass over in a Sloop to England. The Count de Plelo continues here, his Lady being indisposed. The States of the Province of Hollaud are to reassemble here on Wednesday next. It is said the Obstructions to their lowering the Interest on their Obligations, are now removed.
