THEIR Catholick Majesties continue in Health, and divert themselves in seeing the Foundary, the Mint, and the other Curiosities of this City. His Royal Highness the Prince of Asturias, was indisposed with a Cold the 7th Instant, which prevented him and his Princess from attending upon their Catholick Majesties to take the Diversion of Fishing that Day, but he passed the Night very well, and is entirely recovered. On the 8th Instant his Catholick Majesty created three Captains-General of his Army, viz. the Duke of Bourbonville, his first Plenipotentiary at the Congress of Soissons; Count Salazar, Governour of the Prince of Asturias; and Don Lucas Spinola.

Seville, Feb. 18, N. S. Sig. Patino received an Account this Morning from Cadiz, that a Ship was making towards the Bay, which by all the expert was taken to be an *Aviso*, or a Vessel dispatched from the Gallions to give Notice of their Arrival. They are expecting a more certain and particular Account every Moment.

Hague, March 3. M. Van Horn, Deputy to the States General from the Province of Zealand, having been recalled, M. Hurgronje (Brother of M. Hurgronje one of the Dutch Plenipotentiaries at Soissons) has been sent in his Room, and on the 5th Instant was introduced by M. Noyen into the Assembly of the States. M. Greys, Minister of the King of Denmark, has delivered in a Memorial to the States on some Pretensions of Arrears. The Prince of Nassau-Friseland, who was to return to Utrecht, to continue his Studies at that University, has delayed his Departure, in order to be present at the Entertainment and Ball, which his Excellency the Earl of Chesterfield will give on Her Britannick Majesty's Birth-Day. Prince William of Hesse is expected here by the 20th Instant.
