On the 14th Count Zeffirini's Daughter was married to the Marquess Incontri: On which Occasion there was a great Feast and a Ball, which the Great Duke and the Princess Violante honoured with their Prefence. His Highness is frequently among the Masqueraders this Carnival, and is so well pleased with them, that he has given Leave to wear Masks Night and Day; so that all the Streets are full of Persons of both Sexes masked, and in rich Dresses.

Wolfenbuttel, March 8. Brigadier Sutton, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary, arrived here the 3d Instant, and had his Audience the 4th of their Highnesses the Dutchess, by whom he was granized and provided the standard of ciously received. He was conducted to and from his Audience with three of his Serene Highness's Coaches, and all the Ceremonies were observed that are due to a Minister of his Rank.

Paris, March 9; N.S. M. Richard, Brother to the Prefident of that Name, and Commander of Villedieu, is retired at Sixty Years of Age into the Seminary of St. Sulpice, in order to

M. de Morville, his Son, has received from the Marquess de Peze 125000 Livres, which the King had granted to him upon the faid Capitainerie. M. de Morville has also sold by the King's Leave, to Mademosselle de la Rochsuryon for Life, the Apartment his Father had in the Castle of Madrid. M. Hocart de Champirny is named to be Intendant of Canada in the Room of M. Dupuy. The Comptroller General of the Finances succeeds the Duke de Sully in the Government of Gien. The Marquess de Mirepoix is to marry the Marchioness de Combourg, Widow to the Marquess of that Name. Madame Heraut, Wife to the Lieutenant de Police, died the first Instant. The Jubilee for the Diocese of Paris, which was to have been opened the 6th, is put off till the 28th Instant. The Bishop of Brieux is expected here shortly in Quality of Deputy of the States of Bretagne. The Duke de Crussol, Deputy of the Nobility of the States of Languedoc, is arrived, and has thanked the King for the Regiment of Medoc. The ed the King for the Regiment of Medoc.
