THE States of Holland and West-Friseland continue to sit, and have disposed of several Employments and Commissions. The most considerable Civil Employment that was vacant, was that of Counsellour of the Revenues of the Domains of North-Holland, and is given to M. Steyn, Burgomaster of the City of Haerlem; and the chief Military one, was the Command of the Regiment of the late Baron Leefdael, which is given to Colonel Berchem. On the Anniversary of Her Britannick Majesty's Birth-Day, his Excellency the Earl of Chesterfield gave a splendid Entertainment and Ball, at which the Prince of Nassau-Friseland and all the Nobility and Gentry here, were present, in very rich and new Dresses. There was a Table of Fifty Covers, and another of Thirty Six at which the Prince supped, and three of Twenty Covers each. The Ball lasted till next Day; and to entertain the common People, Wine was running at the Doele, which was illuminated. The Prince of Nassau-Friseland left this Place Yesterday Morning to return to Utrecht, having the Day before been with the three Presidents whom he visited at his coming hither, to take Leave of the several Colleges, who returned him their Compliments by the said Presidents. A great Number of People of Distinction waited upon his Highness with their Coaches out of the Town. Count Dehn arrived on Sunday Night from Wolfembuttel, and this Day is gone to Helvoetfluyts to embark To-morrow for England in the Packet-Boat. The Dutchess of Richmond set out on the 13th Instant for Paris; but is to meet the Duke her Husband at Brussels.
