Paris, March 16, N. S.

HE 12th Inftant being the Birth-Day of the Queen of Great Britain, it was celebrated by His Excellency Mr. Poyntz with 2 very magnificent Entertainment, to which all the English here were invited. The King has given the Command of the Town and Citadel of Perpignan, worth 12500 Livres per Annum, to M. de Montesquiou, Brigadier and Lieutenant-Colonel of Marines. M. de la Tona fucceeds M. Montesquiou as Lieutenant-Colonel ; and M. Dumont is made Commander of the fecond Battallion of the faid Regiment of Marines. It is not expected that the Princels of Lorrain will arrive here before the Month of July. Her Royal Highness the Dutchess Dowager of Orleans having passed 15 Days in Retirement in the Convent of la Mágdelaine de Trefnail, arrived here the 14th Inftant at Night.

Dublin, March i. This being Her Majefty's Birth-Day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments on Duty which were drawn out upon Oxman-At Noon the Lords Juffices town-Green. met at the Caftle, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Perfons of Diffinction, before whom a Song was perfor-med : After which their Excellencies, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes, and a Squadron of Dragoons, made a Tour round St. Stephen's Green ; and at Night there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the En-tertainment of the Ladies ; and there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other usual Demonstrations of Joy.
