*Paris, March 16, N. S.*

**T**HE 12th Instant being the Birth-Day of the Queen of Great Britain, it was celebrated by His Excellency Mr. Poyntz with a very magnificent Entertainment, to which all the English here were invited. The King has given the Command of the Town and Citadel of Perpignan, worth 12500 Livres per Annum, to M. de Montefquiou, Brigadier and Lieutenant-Colonel of Marines. M. de la Tona succeeds M. Montefquiou as Lieutenant-Colonel; and M. Dumont is made Commander of the second Battallion of the said Regiment of Marines. It is not expected that the Princess of Lorrain will arrive here before the Month of July. Her Royal Highness the Dutchess Dowager of Orleans having passed 15 Days in Retirement in the Convent of la Magdelaine de Trefnail, arrived here the 14th Instant at Night.

*Dublin, March 1.*

This being Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty which were drawn out upon Oxmantown-Green. At Noon the Lords Justices met at the Castle, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, before whom a Song was performed: After which their Excellencies, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes, and a Squadron of Dragoons, made a Tour round St. Stephen's Green; and at Night there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other usual Demonstrations of Joy.
