N the 2d Inftant Mr. Woodward, Refident from the King of Great Britain, arrived here, and had Audience the next Day of the King of Poland.

Copenhagen, March 15, N. S. On the 2d Inftant arrived here Mr. Titley, who is to have the Care of His Britannick Majefty's Affairs at this Court during the Abfence of the Lord Glenorchy. On the 4th he had Audience of the King of Denmark, and prefented his credential Letters to his Majefty. General Bothmar, His Britannick Majefty's Electoral Minifter, died here on the 9th Inftant of the Gout in his Stomach. The Froft continues here to fuch a Degree, that feveral Deferters have lately paffed over to Sweden upon the Ice, and others are come from thence in the fame Manner. Dr. Yonker, a Phylician from Hall, is lately come hither for the Service of Prince Charles the King of Denmark's Brother, who is reduced to a very bad State of Health. His Danifh Majefty is taking all poffible Meafures for the Reparation of the Damage done to this City by the late terrible Fire. A Dutchman, who propofes to make Brick in a cheaper and better Manner than ufual, is agreed with for that Purpofe; and in order to keep the Money as much as poffible in the Kingdom, the Inhabitants here are to have the neceffary Supplies of Stone from Holffein, and Timber from Norway, at a reafonable Price. The Lord Glenorchy is ftill here, but proposes to fet out for England as foon as the Belts are paffable. **BATLIS** Mayor.

W Hereas Complaint hath been made to this Court That much New York W Court, That great Numbers of loofe and diforderly Perfons do often affemble themfelves at the Place and Times of Execution of the Condemned Malefactors, and that the proper Officers appointed to attend fuch Executions are frequently infulted and molested in the Performance of their Duty: And that the faid Officers who are ordered to affift the Perfons appointed by the Company of Barbers and Surgeens in carrying a Dead Body of the Malefactors to their Hall to be Diffected, according to the Act of Parliament, for the Instruction of the Members of the faid Company in the Science of Anatomy, are frequent-ly abufed and infulted, and are fometimes preventfaid. This Court does therefore order, That the Under Sheriff of Middlefex, and the Officers of the two Compters, who are to attend to fee the Execution performed, do take special Care to prevent any fuch Diffurbances and Infults : And that they affift the Officers of the faid Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying away the Dead Bodies to their Hall. And that if any Person or Perfons do in any manner oppofe or hinder the carrying away any fuch Body, That the faid Of-ficers do feize and apprehend fuch Perfon or Perfons, and carry him or them before a Magistrate; to be dealt with according to Law. And if any Persons, to the Number of Twelve or more, shall obstruct or hinder the stad Officers in their Duty that then the Under-Sheriff of Middlefex shall read the Proclamation in the A& of the First of King George the First, to differse fuch difforderly Per-fons. And if they continue together in such difforderly Manner for the Space of an Hour after such Proclamation, That then the faid Officers do apprehend such Offenders, and carry them before form.
