A PROCLAMATION,

For Suppressing Ricts and Tumults committed by Tinners, and others, within the County of Cornwall, and for apprehending the Offender's therein.

G E O R G E R.W Hereas a Reprefentation hath been made by divers Juffices of the Peace, and other Gentlemen, of Our County of Cornwall, alfembled extraordinarily upon Occasion of certain Riots and great Diforders committed by the Tinners, and others, within Our faid County, That of late the faid Tinners, and divers other Perfons, within Our faid County, have ravaged up and down the Country in a very infolent Manners and in great Num bers, who have prefumed to break open, and enter Dwelling Houfes and Out-houfes, out of which they have forcibly taken and car-ried off great Quantities of Corn, and other Things, the Properties of Our good Subjects; and humbly defining that fome Order might be taken therein, equal to the faid Mifchief and Outrage : And whereas the Juffices and Gentlemen aforefaid have, in their faid Reprefentation, transmitted the Names of certain Persons therein and herein after mentioned, as being notorious Offenders in the Pre-milles; and have also given the ftrongest Af-furances, that they the faid Justices and Centlemen are fully resolved, to the utmost of their Power, to maintain the Peace of Our faid County by all the Ways and Means pol-fible : Now, We being firmly determined to give all due Encouragement and Aflistance to the dutiful and commendable Refolutions and Endeavours of the Justices and Gentlemen aforefaid, and being defirous, for the Security of the Perfons and Properties of Our good

Peace, that the faid Offenders may be brought to Justice, and the like Riots and Diforders be prevented for the future; have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby frictly commanding and requiring all Our Juffices of the Peace, Sheriffs, and Under-Sheriffs, and all other Our Civit Officers whatfoever, that they do use their utmost Endeavours for dilcovering and apprehending the Offenders herein after mentioned, who are particularly named in the faid Reprefentation (that is to fay) James Saim, James Sparga, Richard Rapfy, John Ratfy, An-thony Sandon junior, Anthony Stodden, Tho-mas Towfy, Thomas Towfy junior, John Harvey, alias Goodboy, Abfalom Veal, and Philip Roberts, all of the Partih of Kenwyn in the fild County of Cornella. Tumblyn, of the Parish of Cornwall; Tumblyn, of the Parish of Saint Agnes in the fame County; William Rofevear, Wil-liam Trewin, and John Jeffery, all of the Parish of Saint Ewe, in the fame County; Stephen Trewin, and Thomas Harris alias Kittoe, of the Patish of Saint Mewan in the fume County; and alfo all other Perfons fame County; and alfo all other Perfons,' who have been, or fhall be guilty of, or in any wife concerned in fuch riorous and dangerous Practices, to the End that they may be brought to Justice. And We do hereby promise and declare, that if any Person concerned in any of the faid Riots or Tumults, fhall difcover and apprehend, or caufe to be difcovered and apprehended, any Two or more of the Perfons concerned therein, fo as they may be convicted of fuch Offence, fuch Discoverer shall have Our most Gracious Pardon : And as a further Encouragement to the Discoverers of fuch notorious Offenders, We do also hereby promise and declare, that any Perfon or Perfons, who fhall difco-ver and apprehend, or caufe to be difcovered, and apprehended, any of the Perfons herein Subjects, and the Prefervation of the publick | before particularly named, shall have and receive

apprehended, fo as he may be convicted of fuch Offence, the Sum of Forty Pounds; which Sum the Commiffioners of Our Treafury, or Our High Trealurer of Great Britain for the time being, are hereby directed and required, from Time to Time, to pay accor-dingly, without any further or other War-rant in that Behalf. And we do hereby further strictly charge and command all Our Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Under-Sheriffs, and other Officers aforelaid, that they do use the most effectual Means for suppresfing all Riots and Tumults; and to that End do effectually put in Execution an Act of Par-liament made in the First Year of the Reign of our late Royal Father of Glorious Me-mory [entituled, An ASt for preventing Tu-mults and riotous Affemblies, and for the more fpeedy and effectual punifoing the Rio-ters] and all other Laws and Statutes made against Riots, Routs, and unlawful Affem-blies; and that the faid Justices, and all other our Civil Officers, to whom it doth apperour Civil Officers, to whom it doth apper-tain, do give the necellary Directions, that fufficient Watch and Ward be duly kept at fuch Times and Places, as they shall judge necellary for the preventing and suppressing the like Disorders. And we do hereby further firictly charge and command all our Officers, Civil and Military, and all other our loving Subjects, that they be aiding and affifting in the Execution of Our Commands herein, and in the apprehending and taking the Perfons above-named, and all other Perfons, who have offended, pr shall hereaster offend in manner aforefaid. And we do hereby charge and command, that the faid Offenders be profecuted with the utmost Severity and Rigour of Law, We being relolved to suppress such Riots and Tumults by a most strict and exemplary Punishment of all such Offenders, as have been already, or shall be discovered. And we do hereby command the respective Juffices of the Peace, and other Magistrates aforelaid, that they do from Time to Time transmit an exact Account of what they shall do pursuant to this Our Royal Proclamation, to one of Our Principal Secretaries of State.
