## Hague, April 12, N.S.

HE States of the Province of Holland continue affembled, and the feveral Admiralties are come hither and are daily in Conference with the Deputies of the faid States and those of the States General, for fettling the Number of Men of War to be fitted out and employed by the Republick the enfuing Summer. One of thole Conferences was held Yefterday, when the Earl of Chefterfield was prefent. Our last Letters from Spain advise, that his Catholick Majesty has not yet fixed the Indulto on the Effects brought

by the Galleons. Paris, April 13, N. S. The Family of Orleans has with the King's Permittion gone into Mourning for the Duke of Lorrain, notwithftanding that Prince's Death has not been yet notified to his most Christian Ma-jesty. The last Letters from Marseilles ad-vise, that M. Blondel, Intendant of the Gallies, was dead there fuddenly. The Bifhop of St. Brieux, Deputy for the Clergy of Brit-tany is arrived at Verfailles. On the 5th Inftant the Queen Dowager of Spain went in Ceremony to the Palais Royal, to compliment the Duke of Orleans upon his Marriage. The Marshal de Villeroy is indifpofed.

Whitehall, April 8. On Easter Sunday the King and Queen, His Royal-Highneis the Prince of Wales, their Royal Highnesles the three eldest Prin-cesses, with feveral of the Bishops, and other Persons of Quality, received the Holy Sacrament in the Royal Chappel at St.

James's ; the Communion Service being performed by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of London Dean of the Chappel : The Sermon was preached by the Right Re-verend the Lord Bishop. of Chester, in the Ablence of his Grace the Archbishop of York Lord Almoner.
