HE Body of M. Canillac having been deposited for some Time in the Church of St. Paul, has been buried in the Convent of the Minimes in the Place Royal. M. Petcum, Captain and Aid-Major of the French Guards, died the 12th Inftant of an Apoplexy. M. Landais, Treafurer-General of the Artillery, died the roth. The Countels of Caylus is likewife dead, after a long Illnefs. On the 13th the new Altar of the Choir of St. Germane Auxerrois was confecrated. The Marquess de Gandelu, Second Son to the Duke de Tremes, is to be married to Mademoiselle de Tingri, Daughter to the Prince of that Name. The Duke de Chaulnes is made Governour of the Town and Citadel of Amiens, in the Room of M. Canillac. The Marquefs de Montbriffier, Sub-Lieutenant of the fecond Troop of Mufquetaires, is made Captain-Lieutenant of the faid Troop. Hague, April 19. The States of Holland
