Paris, April 16, N. S.

THE Body of M. Canillac having been deposited for some Time in the Church of St. Paul, has been buried in the Convent of the Minimes in the Place Royal. M. Petcum, Captain and Aid-Major of the French Guards, died the 12th Instant of an Apoplexy. M. Landais, Treasurer-General of the Artillery, died the 10th. The Countess of Caylus is likewise dead, after a long Illness. On the 13th the new Altar of the Choir of St. Germaine Auxerrois was consecrated. The Marquess de Gandelu, Second Son to the Duke de Tremes, is to be married to Mademoiselle de Tingri, Daughter to the Prince of that Name. The Duke de Chaulnes is made Governour of the Town and Citadel of Amiens, in the Room of M. Canillac. The Marquess de Montbriffier, Sub-Lieutenant of the second Troop of Mousquetaires, is made Captain-Lieutenant of the said Troop.

Hague, April 19. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland are adjourned till the 3d of May next, after having given their Consent for the fitting out of a Squadron of Twelve Men of War for the Service of this Year. It is thought the Command of this Squadron will be given to M. Sommellydyke, and that M. Grave is to command under him. The Lord Glenorchy is arrived here from Copenhagen, and will set out for England in a few Days.
