Edenburgh, May 9. He Spredwel Frigat hath brought into Leith fix Dutch Prizes laden with Salt and other Commodities from Spain and Portugal, viz. The s. John Evangelist of Rotterdam, John Beueser Master, bur-then 70 Last, the Hollandia of Horne, Roger Jacobs Master, 180 Last; the Red Com of Flyland, Albert Isbrin: Malter, 170 Last; the Town of Dantzick of Flylande Le nard Sebrant Master, 125 Last; the Sun of Horne, Simon Velter Mafter, 170 Laft; and the Prince of Amfterdam, 150 Laft : besides which, our Privateers have likewise brought in several Dutch ships of the same Fleet.

Venice, april 30. On Thursday last parted hence the Marquis Gentitles on his jonney to Milan, and the next day arrived here the Sieur de Furstembergh from Roma he being as we are told, employed by his Hpliness on some message to the Emperor. The of the next month Signior Pietro Mocenigo will certainly part hence on his Ambassy to Rome, having already taken his leave of the Duke and Senate, and other the most eminent persons of quality here. The Senate hath at length made, choice of Signior Leonardi Zani, to go their Ambassador to the Court of Spain, and to reside there in the room of Signior Consarini, who hath at his earnest instance, men., From Dalmavia we have advice, of the peace able condition of those Countreys; and that Signior Morofini, General Governor there, had finally accommodated all differences with the Balla of Boff 4, to their muqual satissaction.

From the Port we cannot hear of any thing, fare ne great preparations that are making there for Viar, than their defignes are carried on with so much secrecy, that it is not as yet discovered whether these Forces are to be employed against Po-I ad or I' ingary; we are told, that the Grand Vifire which lately arrived the fire at their Armies in cale heapresently returned, might receive from him a particular account of their preparations, or other matters he heavy have observed during his being there; which proceeding fecms to give us more caufe rto doubt the good intentions of the Port towards

the Empire.

Sodan, Mar 9, The 29 past the Prince of Conde arrived as Rheims, and the next day here, where he hath appointed a General Rendevous of all the Forces to be Commanded by him, in order ko their March, which as we are now told, will be

Rowards Liege.

Charleroy, May 13. The 3 instant came bither his most Christian Majesty, accompanied by the Duke of Orleans, the several Troops arriving both before and after his Majesty, together with his Train and Baggage, which was very great; the 7 instant the Marshal Turgage marched hence with 2000 men, Horse and Doot towards Liege, carrying with him 30 pieces of Ordnance, and above 4000 Waggons aden wirk Ammunition and Money.

On Munday last arrived here dood Horses who is

were immediately quartered at Binch, Fountain-l'Evesque, and other places hereabouts; the same day his Majesty ordered a general review to be made of all his Forces here, which con-sisted of above 35000 h.en; the next day his Majesty began his march from hence, and Lodged that night at Tongrenelle, and was yesterday with his Army at Rosers. Before his Majesties departure came hither several of the Subjects of the Spanish Neatherlands, to defire Safeguards of his Majelly; from whom they received for answer; That they had no need of any, he having already strictly commanded all his Forces, not to give them the leaft diflurbance in their passage through or near, any of their Countries.

Cologne, May 13. The Prince of Conde who we had expected in these parts, is as we are told from Sedan, marched thence with his Army towards Liege, to joyn with the rest of the French Forces there, in order to their attacking Maestricht, which place seems very much threatned, and in so much danger, that it is said, several of the Officers in Garrison there, have desired leave to quit their Commands. Our Elector finding that the States General of the United Provinces, not contented with the Neutrality be had declared he would exactly preserve in the present Conjuncture, have ordered their Troops to commit several Hostilities in his Territories, hath as we are told, resolved for the security of the peace of his Countries, to declare War against the said States, the Elector of Bavaria having promised, that in such case, he will send several Forces to his assistance. The French Troops that are quartered in this Electorate, have orders to march towards Maestricht and in the mean time the Duke of Luxemburgh is gone for Munster, where he is to Command In chief the Forces of that Bishop, who are said to be already on their march towards Groningen and Over Iffel. From the Court at Vienna; we are allarmed with the news of the designs of the Turks to attack Hungary this Summer, fo that the Imperial Troops which were once intended to be employed in these parts, for the security of the Empire, are now ordered that way, where there feems to be far greater need of them

Macstricht, May 13. The French Forces begin now to approach us on all sides, and plainly discover their intention is to attacque this place; upon which allarme many of the Inhabitants having fled their habitations here, and retired to other places in Liege and Flanders, our Governor hath fome days fince published an Order, commanding them to return forthwith to their respective homes, on pain of being very severely proceeded agains, which it is thought will hardly have any effect, but rather that the rest, both of the Inhabitants and Soldiers will be glad of any occasion to quit a place of so much danger, as this is likely to be His most Christian Majesty is at present lodged with the gross of his Army near Tangres, and may as our advices tell us, be in a day or two at farthest expected before this place, in the mean time the fame care is taken
