*Dresden, April 23, N. S.*

**A**LL Preparations are made and Orders given for Relais of Horses to be ready, for the King's setting out on Tuesday next for Poland. His Majesty will take his Way by Pilnitz. Count Hoyin, M. Lohs Master of the Horse, and the Vice-Chancellour of Poland, are appointed to go in the Coach with his Majesty. The Hoffmarshal and several others are ordered to follow on Saturday, and Count Manteuffel and the Officers of the Chancery on the 2d or 3d of May. M. Seckendorf, the Emperour's Minister, took Leave Yesterday of his Polish Majesty, and set out last Night for Berlin.

*Paris, April 23, N. S.* The Marchioness de Buffly Rabutin de Montaterre died the 18th Instant, in the 80th Year of her Age. The Bishop of Lucon her Brother is indisposed, as is likewise the Marshal d'Alegre. M. de Voltaire is returned hither from England. M. de Hericourt, Commissary of the Marine, succeeds M. Blondel as Intendant of the Gallies at Marseilles.

*Hague, April 29, N. S.* On the 27th arrived here an Express from M. van Hoey the Ambassadour of the States General at the Court of France. That Ambassadour's Lady and Daughter are returned hither from Paris. M. Tromer, one of the Criminals who was banished for betraying the Secret Resolutions of the States, is retired to Overysfel, by the Recommendation of which Province he was

employed in the Secretary of State's Office here, and has appealed to the Court of Justice of Overysfel, and petitioned for Subsistance. Letters from Copenhagen of the 23d N. S. advise, that M. Assendelft, the Minister of the States General at that Court, had received his Letter of Revocation from their High Mightinesses, and was preparing to take his Leave of his Danish Majesty and return hither.
