Dresden, April 26, N. S.

THE King of Poland set out from hence at Four a-Clock this Morning for Warfaw; where he proposes to arrive in seven Days: But by all Accounts he is likely to be much longer upon the Road, the Ways being excessive bad.

Berlin, April 30, N. S. On the 10th of May the King and Queen are to come hither from Potsdam: The Margrave of Anspach is expected the 18th, and on the 22d the Ceremony of his Marriage with the Princess Frederica, their Prussian Majesties Second Daughter, will be performed.

Hague, May 6, N. S. The States of Holland have been assembled since the 3d Instant; and have under their Deliberation the Tax called Family-Geld. 800,000 Florins have been negociated by Way of Loan, and raised in a very few Days, to supply the Charges of the Squadron now fitting out; which Squadron will be ready to put to Sea about the End of this Month.

Extract of a Letter from Rear-Admiral St. Lo, to Mr. Burchett, dated at Port-Royal at Jamaica, the 14th of February 1728-9.

I Have the Satisfaction to acquaint you, that on the 9th Instant I received a Letter from the Speaker of the Assembly, wherein he gives me the Thanks of the House for my Care for the Good of the Island, in guarding the Sea-Coast, and protecting and defending the Trade thereof; and, as an Addition to their Compliment, they have presented me with One Thousand Pounds, this Country Money.

WHEREAS Complaint hath been made to this Court, That great Numbers of loose and disorderly Persons do often assemble themselves at the Place and Times of Execution of the condemned Malefactors, and that the proper Officers appointed to attend such Executions are frequently insulted and molested in the Performance of their Duty; And that the said Officers, who are ordered to assist the Persons appointed by the Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying a dead Body of the Malefactors to their Hall to be dissected, according to the Act of Parliament, for the Instruction of the Members of the said Company in the Science of Anatomy, are frequently abused and insulted,

and are sometimes prevented from carrying away such dead Body, as aforesaid. This Court doth therefore order, That the Under-Sheriff of Middlesex, and the Officers of the two Compters, who are to attend to see the Execution performed, do take special Care to prevent any such Disturbances and Insults: And that they assist the Officers of the said Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying away the dead Bodies to their Hall. And that if any Person or Persons do in any Manner oppose or hinder the carrying away any such Body, that the said Officers do seize and apprehend such Person or Persons, and carry him or them before a Magistrate, to be dealt with according to Law. And if any Persons, to the Number of Twelve or more, shall obstruct or hinder the said Officers in their Duty, that then the Under-Sheriff of Middlesex shall read the Proclamation in the Act of the First of King George the First, to disperse such disorderly Persons. And if they continue together in such disorderly Manner for the Space of an Hour after such Proclamation, that then the said Officers do apprehend such Offenders, and carry them before some Magistrate, to be dealt with according to Law. And it is further ordered, that this Order be printed and published in some of the publick News-Papers, and affixed at Newgate, the Place of Execution, and other publick Places within this City and Liberties thereof.
