**M**. Gabriel, the Comptroller-General of the Buildings of Versailles, went the 10th Instant to Bourdeaux, in order to take a Plan of a new Square and Bridge which are to be built there. The same Day died the Dean of the Chapter of St. Opportune, which Dignity is in the Gift of the Chapter of St. Germain l'Auxerrois. The first Battalion of the Militia for the Generality of Paris, is assembled this Week at St. Denis. The Duke de Tremes, and his Son the Duke de Gevres, are gone to St. Owen, their Country House near Paris, for the Recovery of their Healths. The Prince and Princess of Tingry are to go shortly to Valenciennes, of which Place the Prince of Tingry is Governor. The Marquis de Peze, Colonel of the King's Regiment, is gone to Cambray to review that Regiment, and is afterwards to go to Metz. The Bishop of Lubeck having left Paris the 9th Instant, in order to take Leave of the most Christian King here, found himself out of Order at Senlis, and immediately returned back to Paris. M. de Foffingan, formerly Commissary General at Calais, is made Commissary of the Marine at St. Malo. A Law Suit which the Cardinal de Bissy, as Abbot of St. Germain, had with the Chapter of Notre Dame, on Account of their Spiritual Jurisdiction, has been lately determined in favour of the latter. Great solemn Services are performing daily at Paris in the Religious Houses and Parish Churches, for the Repose of the Soul of the Cardinal de Noailles. Deputies from Tripoly are arrived at Paris. The Marquis de Nangis, Inspector of the Troops, is gone into Flanders. M. de Valincourt, a Member of the French Academy, and Secretary General of the Marine, has had an Attack of the Apoplexy.
