N the rft Inftant, at Eleven in the Morning, His Britannick Majefty paffed through Utrecht: Having been met near that Town by the Prince of Naffau Frifeland, who ftep'd out of his Coach as foon as he was in Sight of His Majefty; who did the fame, and having embraced his Highnefs, difcourfed with him, while frefh Horfes were put to his Majefty's Coach, after which the King proceeded on his Journey for Hanover. The Lord Townfhend arrived here the 3rft paft at Night, and lodged in the Earl of Chefterfield's Houle; who the next Day entertained his Lordfhip, all the Foreign Minifers, and other Perfons of Quality, magnificently at Dinner, at two very large Tables. His Lordfhip and the Earl of Chefterfield have had feveral Conferences with the chief Perfons of this Republick, and this Morning his Lordfhip fet out in Order to join His Majefty with all poffible Expedition. The Lord Torrington went this Morning from hence for Amfterdam, where his Lordfhip will ftay one Day, and then return to Helvoetfluys to fail back to England with the Yachts, and fome Ships of War, having already fent the largeft ships back to their Ports. The Squadron of this Republick, which was fitting out to fail to the Baltick, is countermanded.

Kenfington, May 23. This Day Caffem Hojah, Envoy from the Government of Tripoly in Barbary, had a private Audience of Leave of her Royal Highnefs the Princefs Royal, and their Royal Highneffes the Princefles Amelia and Caroline; to whom he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell, Knt. Mafter of the Ceremonies.

Excife-Office, London, May 20, 1729. Whereas by an AE p: ffed the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An AE for laying a Duty upon Comp und Waters or Spirits, and for Licenfing the Retailers thereof, It is enacted, that from and after the fift Day of July next, all Manner of Perfons are obliged and required to take sut a Licence for the Selling or Retailing any of the mixed or compound Spirits or Liquors, as in the faid AE are particularly mentioned, ten Days, at leaft, before they Iball offer to fell or retail the fame in any Quantity lefs than a Gallon, and likewife obliged and required to take out a frefb Licence for that Purpofe ten Days at leaft before the Expiration of twelve Months after taking out the first Licence, and in the fime Manner to renew fuch Licence from Tear to Tear, paying down the Sum of twenty Pounds at the Time of taking out the first Licence, and AE they are required to renew fuch Licence, on Pain of forfeising the Sum of fifry Pounds.
