HIS Britannick Majesty arrived here on Saturday last, the 24th Instant, about Noon, in perfect Health, God be praised.

Paris, June 8, N. S. On Whitsunday the 5th Instant, there was a Procession of the Knights of the Holy Ghost at Versailles, and the New Archbishop of Paris officiated at the Ceremony. It is assured that the King will go shortly to pass Six Weeks at Marly. The Court has quitted the Six Weeks Mourning for the Duke of Lorraine. M. le Duc has given the Post of Governor of his Guards in Burgundy to the Chevalier de la Marck.

Hague, June 10. M. Vanhoey, Ambassadour of this Republick at Paris, having obtained Leave from the States to come hither for two Months, on Account of his private Affairs, is expected here in a few Days. On the 8th Instant, the Emperor's Envoy Extraordinary, Count Kinsky and his Lady, arrived here from England, and will set out for Hanover on Monday next. The Marquês d'Aix, Minister of the King of Sardinia, and Count Dehn, Minister of the Duke of Wolfembutel, who lately came over from England, are gone to wait upon His Majesty at Hanover.
