*Hanover, June 20, N. S.*

**O**N the 17th Instant Count Dehn, the Duke of Wolfenbittel's Minister, set out for Brunswick, from whence he is expected back on Wednesday next. On the 18th the King went early in the Morning from Herrenhausen into a Plain in the Neighbourhood of this City, to review the Regiment of his Foot-Guards, consisting of two Battallions or 1400 Men. His Majesty being under a Tent, and attended by the Lord Viscount Townshend, Brigadier-General Surton, the Felt-Marshal Bulau, several of the General Officers, and all the Gentlemen of this Court, caused the Officers as well as the Soldiers of the Regiment to rank off before Him, and His Majesty having viewed them Man by Man, the whole Regiment drew up in a Line, and performed their Exercises with great Regularity. After which they made several Evolutions, and the two Battallions fronting one another, fired in great Order in Platoons, hollow Squares, &c. The whole lasted till almost One a-Clock in the Afternoon, when His Majesty returned to Herrenhausen, having expressed his Satisfaction to the Felt-Marshal, as well as to the Principal Officers of that Regiment, one of the Majors whereof was made a Lieutenant-Colonel. The same Day Count Kinski arrived here with his Lady, and was presented in the Evening to His Majesty at Herrenhausen. The same Night Brigadier-General Sutton returned to Wolfenbittel, but is expected here again on Wednesday next. Yesterday after Divine Service, His Majesty made several Promotions amongst the Officers of his German Troops, and towards Night Prince William of Hesse arrived here from Cassel. He being lodged in one of the King's Houses in this City, and attended by His Majesty's Officers, was conducted this Morning in one the King's Coaches to Herrenhausen, where His Majesty received him very graciously. He dined afterwards with the King, and in Company of several of the foreign Ministers. The Review of the Horse-Guards, which was to have been this Morning, is put off to the latter End of the Week.

*Hanover, June 21, N. S.* M. Hop, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General in England, being arriv'd here the Night before last, was introduced Yesterday Morning to His Majesty. To-morrow being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Succession to the Crown, the same will be celebrated at Court, and there will be a French Play acted at Herrenhausen by the King's Comedians.

*Dublin, June 12.*

Yesterday being the Day of His Majesty's happy Succession to the Throne, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty which were drawn out on Oxmantown Green: At Noon their Excellencies the Lords Justices met at the Castle, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction. After which their Excellencies, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes and a Squadron of Horse, made a Tour round St. Stephen's Green; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

Whitehall, May 2, 1729.

Whereas on Friday the 11th Day of April last, about nine a Clock at Night, William Pearce, a Tidesman on the Bort of London, going by Water from Whitehall Stairs towards London Bridge, three Persons unknown, in Disguise, their Faces appearing black, as if covered with Crape, and the Brims of their Hats pulled down over them, came in a Wherry along-side the Boat he was in, and having asked his Name, which he told them, they laid hold of him, and endeavoured to pull him out of the Boat, in order, as it most probable, to have drowned him, but were prevented by other Boats which happening to pass by at the same Time, came to his Assistance. And whereas from the Expressions used by the said Persons in Disguise, there is the greatest Reason to believe, that they mistook the said William Pearce for Thomas Pearce, another Tidesman, resembling him in Face and Stature, whom they intended to murder, in Revenge for the great Service he has done in detecting and convicting several Persons guilty of very notorious Frauds, to the Prejudice of His Majesty's Revenue, and of the fair Merchants, in stealing and running Tobacco and other Goods, who have thereupon been brought to condign Punishment. His Majesty for the better Discovery of an Attempt so barbarous and inhuman, and so highly criminal, is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the Offenders, who shall discover his Accomplices, so as they be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a farther Encouragement for such Discovery, His Majesty is pleased to promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Person or Persons whatsoever, who shall make the said Discovery, payable by the Receiver General of His Majesty's Customs, on the Conviction of one or more of the said Offenders.
