Rigadier-General Sutton, who went lately to Wolfenbuttel by the King's Order, returned hither the 21st Instant ; as did the next Morning Count Dehn the Duke of Wolfenbuttel's Minister, who had likewife been to make a Tour to his Court. The 22d being the Anniverfary of the King's Inaugu-ration, the fame was celebrated here with great Solemnity and Splendor. In the Morning a Sermon fuitable to the Occasion was preach'd before the Lord Townshend, by the Reverend Dr. Knipe, His Majesty's Chaplain, where all the English Gentlemen that are here, were present. After which his Lordship went to Herrenhausen, where the Court was very fplendid and numerous, to compliment His Majefty on His Succeffion to the Throne. His Lordship gave on that Occasion a very noble Entertainment to Prince Wil-liam of Heffe, to all the Foreign Minifters, and to a great many Perfons of Diffinction here. After Dinner his Lordfhip caufed Plenty of Claret and Rhenifh Wine to be given to the Popu-lace, and Gold and Silver to be thrown out to them. Towards the Evening all the Ladies repaired to Herrenhausen, where there was a mag-nificent Ball, which lasted till One of the Clock the next Morning. On the 23d the Count of Waldeck, who is in the Emperour's Service, arrived here. As His Majesty intends to make a Progress in His German Dominions, and to see the Mines at the Hartz, Orders have been issued the Mines at the Hartz, Orders have been lined for repairing with all Diligence the Roads which His Majefty is to pafs: However, the Time for His Majefty's fetting out on this Progrefs is not yet fixed. On the 24th the King gave Audience at Herrenhaufen to the Deputies of the States of Hoya, one of the Provinces of this Electorate ; as alfo to the Deputies of the City of Bremen, who complimented His Majefty upon His Arrival in His German Dominions. The fame Day Baron Stein, Minister to the Duke of Wolfenbuttel, arrived here, and was prefented in the Evening to His Majesty. On the 25th the King, attended by Prince William of Hesse, the Lord Viscount Townshend, and the whole Court, went to re-view the Squadron of His Life-Guards, consisting

of 150 Men: They were drawn up in three Ranks, through which His Majefty paffed, and caufed them afterwards to march off before Him, Man by Man; after which they formed again, and performed their Exercife both on Horfeback and on Foot, in a very handfome Manner. The whole lafted till Noon, when His Majefty's returned to Herrenhaufen. Yefterday arrived here M. de Wedderkop, on the Part of the Duke of Holftein, to compliment His Majefty, and 'tis faid he will refide here during His Majefty's Stay. Mr. Hendel paffed through this Place fome Days 2go, coming from Italy, and returning to England. Several Domeflicks of M. de Broglie, the French Ambaffadour, together with his Equipage, arrived here the other Day, and his Excellency himfelf is expected fhortly.

Baron Schleinitz, another of the Duke of Wolfenbuttel's Ministers, who has refided for fome Time at Soiffons on the Part of the Duke his Master, arrived here on the 26th from Brunswick, and had the same Day an Audience of the King; and Yesterday M. de Liening and M. Eiben were also introduced to His Majesty, to compliment Him on His faste Arrival here, the one on the Part of the Prince of Anhalt Zerbst, and the other on the Part of the Dutchess Dowager of Holstein Eutin. The Count de la Lippe Buckebourg arrived here last Night.
