The King's Journey to the Hartz is now fixed to the 23d Instant, and his Majesty has named the Officers of his Court that are to attend his Majesty, who intends to dine the first Day at Sessen, a Country House of the Duke of Wolfenbuttel's, that Duke and his Dutchess having invited his Majesty. The Review of the Hessian Troops near Munden is fixed to the 29th or 30th Instant; after which his Majesty will go to see the several Studs he has in the Neighbourhood of Munden, and so return to Herrenhausen. The whole Jour-

ney will last ten or twelve Days.
