**T**HE King enjoys, God be thanked; perfect Health at Herrenhausen, where his Majesty had a French Comedy acted last Tuesday upon the Theatre in the Garden. On Wednesday Messieurs Wedderkop, the one Minister from the Duke of Wolfenbittel, and the other from the Duke of Holstein Gottorp, took their Leave of his Majesty, and returned to their respective Courts. Yesterday Morning the Count de la Lippe Buckebourg came hither again from Buckebourg, together with his Mother the Countess Dowager. The latter is lodged at Court, and had the Honour to dine and sup Yesterday with the King at Herrenhausen. The King's Journey to the Hartz is now fixed to the 23d Instant, and his Majesty has named the Officers of his Court that are to attend his Majesty, who intends to dine the first Day at Sellen, a Country House of the Duke of Wolfenbittel's, that Duke and his Dutches having invited his Majesty. The Review of the Hessian Troops near Munden is fixed to the 29th or 30th Instant; after which his Majesty will go to see the several Studs he has in the Neighbourhood of Munden, and so return to Herrenhausen. The whole Journey will last ten or twelve Days.

*Paris, July 9, N. S.* The Dutches de la Meillaraye is gone to Forges, for the Benefit of the Waters. M. d'Artaguet, Syndick of the India Company, is married to Mademoiselle de la Vacherie, Daughter to the Governour of the Citadel of Arras. Father du Trevoux, a famous Jesuit, and Confessor to the late Duke of Orleans, is dead in his 84th Year. M. de Fontenay, Receiver-General of the Finances of Flanders, has sold his Post, by the King's Leave, to M. de Villette. The King has named the Abbot de Verthamon to the Bishoprick of Montauban.

*Hague, July 12, N. S.* The States of the Province of Holland being to assemble to Morrow, most of the Members are arrived here, as are also several Persons to solicit Preferments to the Civil and Military Offices now vacant. The Earl of Albemarle, who has been over here for a short Time, set out this Afternoon for Helvoetfluyts to return to England. The Emperour's Envoy here, has had a Conference with Deputies of the Council of State about the Affairs of East-Friseland.
