BARON Redefel being arrived here on the Part of the Duke of Saxe-Gotha, was introduced Yesterday to the King; as was likewise M. de Beckendorff, Marshal to the Margrave of Anspach. Baron Stein, Count Dehri, and Baron Schleinitz, the Duke of Wolfenbuttel's three Ministers, set out last Night for Sesen, a Country House belonging to the Duke, with whom His Majesty designs to dine there To-morrow, and to pursue afterwards his Journey to the Hartz. His Majesty lies To-morrow at Osterode, and continues there on Sunday; the Monday following he goes to Clausthall, to see the Mines, &c. which will take His Majesty up three Days; after which he designs to repair to Hertzberg, where he intends to hunt, and so to proceed to Munden and Cassel, to view the Hessian Troops. The Lord Townshend, accompanied by his Son Mr. Townshend and General Diemar, set out this Afternoon for Sesen, where he stays for the King, and thence accompanies His Majesty in His Journey. The greatest Part of the Officers named by the King to attend him in his Journey, set out this Evening for Osterode.
