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*Hanover, July 25, N. S.*

**H**IS Majesty set out last Saturday at Eight a-Clock in the Morning from Herrenhausen on his Journey to the Hartz, and, according to our Advices, arrived that Evening at Osterrode. Count Kinski the Imperial Minister, M. de Hop the Dutch Envoy, and General Diemar Minister from the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel, attended His Majesty in His Journey. Count Plettenberg, Minister from the Electors of Bavaria and Cologne, is gone from hence to Cassel, to see the Review of the Hessian Troops; but is expected back here after the King's Return.

*Clausthal, July 26.* The King having left Herrenhausen on the 23d, about Eight in the Morning, passed through Hildesheim, where he found the Citizens under Arms, and was saluted by a triple Discharge of the Cannon from the Ramparts. At One a-Clock in the Afternoon his Majesty came to Bornhausen, a Place belonging to the Abbess of Ganderheim, where his Majesty stopp'd in the Inn to dress himself. Between that Place and Sefen, forty of his Majesty's Life-Guard, with their proper Officers, were posted, who attended him to Sefen, where he arrived at Two a-Clock. Before the Duke's House there, one Battallion, called the Regiment of Bevern, was drawn up, and his Majesty was received at his stepping out of his Coach by the Duke and Dutchess of Wolfenbuttel. His Majesty led the Dutchess into the Apartments. Soon after his Majesty went to dine with the said Duke and Dutchess, a magnificent Entertainment being prepared, which lasted till Five a-Clock, when his Majesty reviewed the Battallion above-mentioned; and after having taken Leave of the Duke and Dutchess, set out for Osterrode, where he arrived at half an Hour after Eight in the Evening, and lay there that Night. On Sunday the 24th, after Dinner, his Majesty pursued his Journey hither, and arrived at

Six in the Evening; the Miners were drawn up in two Ranks, Part of them with their Lamps burning, and others playing on Musick. His Majesty appeared in a Balcony from Seven till Nine, and caused the Miners to march by him twice; afterwards he went to Supper, during which the Miners played upon their Instruments and fung. On Monday the 25th, his Majesty having dressed himself in Miners Cloaths, accompanied by M. de la Forest in the same Dress, went to the Mine called Dorothea, which he descended, and remounted through another Adjacent, which is called Carolina. His Majesty enjoys, God be thanked, perfect Health.

*Hague, July 26, N. S.* The States of Holland and West-Friesland having filled up several Vacancies of Employments, adjourned on the 23d Instant till the 10th of August. The Government of the Sas van Gent, which lately became vacant by the Death of Colonel la Rocque, is given to Colonel Haerfolte. Prince Frederick of Auvergne is arrived here from Strasburg; and Prince Henry his Brother, Archbishop of Vienne in France, is expected here soon. Last Sunday Count Sincendorff, the Emperour's Envoy here, left this Place, in order, as 'tis said, to take a View of some of the Provinces of this Republick.

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
